Media: three Leduc Rep newspaper articles

Update: H. Lovett reported to the Library Director that one hundred twenty-eight, (128), people participated in the Harry Potter escape room. Most of the participants were youth.

3. Report from council – L. Hansen

Arbor day was held May 7th, 2022 in South Telford in a wetland area. One hundred sixty-one (161) participants planted seven hundred fifty (750) trees. The number of participants and trees planted was higher than last year.

Teen Takeover, at the LRC, on May 14th had more participants than ever.

Provincial legislation restricts the density in Leduc's downtown core due to the proximity to the airport. Council is seeking changes to promote growth and development in the area.

There is an upcoming funding re-announcement for the 65th avenue interchange. Construction is scheduled to begin soon.

The e-scooters project has started. This is a two-year pilot project with Bird Canada providing the scooters.

The city is looking to develop a schedule to plan for a recreation site in the 'West Campus'.

The Clean Energy Improvement Program (CEIP) launches May 30th. The application is available on the city webpage, search CEIP.

T. Tijani has heard of problems with the e-Scooters in Edmonton. L. Hansen addresses concerns. Discussion.

4. Round Robin

T. Tijani: found new board member training sessions very informative. Discussion regarding get together after June board meeting.

T. Turner: Teen Takeover event was held at the LRC on May 14th. There were seven hundred twenty-eight (728) participants between the ages of twelve (12) to seventeen (17). The next Teen Takeover event is scheduled for October 1st. The committee hopes the event can be held twice a year.

The Edmonton Symphony Orchestra is performing a 'pay-what-you-can concert at the Maclab Centre, May 24th.

T. Turner and T. Berry will have a presentation to council May 24th regarding Treaty, Truth, and Reconciliation. They will also be discussing services and fees for the Maclab Centre.

T. Tijani asks if there have been any more incidents in the library since the April banning. There was a concern one evening for the safety of a patron talking about suicide. Staff managed it well. Discussion.

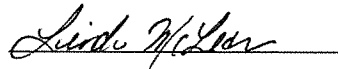
